

Discretionary visa conditions:

Visa rule 8105 (All subclasses)

You cannot work more than 20 hours a week when your course is in session (other than work which has been registered as a part of the course).

Note:

- No work limits apply during recognised periods of vacation offered by your education provider.

- This condition cannot be granted with an initial student visa.

Visa rule 8203 (Subclass 573)

You **must not** change your course, or your thesis or research topic, unless the department has granted approval.

Visa rule 8204 (Subclass 572)

You **must not** undertake or change a course, or a thesis or research topic for one of the following **unless** the department has granted approval: Graduate certificate; Graduate diploma; Masters' degree; Doctorate Bridging course required as a prerequisite to a course of study or research for a master's degree or a doctorate.

Visa rule 8303 (All subclasses)

You **must not** become involved in any activities that are disruptive to, or in violence threatening harm to, the Australian community or a group within the Australian community.

Visa rule 8523 (All subclasses)

Your family unit members must not leave Australia later than you.

Visa rule 8534 (All subclasses)

You are **not** entitled to be granted a further substantive visa, other than a Student Visa with Permission to Work (made on form 157P or 157P Internet), a Graduate—Skilled (subclass 497)

visa, or a Protection Visa, while you remain in Australia.

Note: the effect of this visa condition is that, except in extremely limited circumstances, it will not be possible for you to remain in Australia beyond the authorised period of stay shown on your visa label.

Mandatory conditions are attached to all student visas, while discretionary conditions are attached according to individual circumstances.

Mandatory Visa Conditions:

Visa rule 8101

You **cannot** work in Australia.

Note: student visas issued on or after 26 April 2008 automatically have the work permit included. You **cannot work until your provider notifies DIAC that you have started your course (up to 2 weeks after the course starts).**

Visa rule 8202

You **must** remain enrolled in a full-time registered course. You **must** attend at least 80% of the contact hours scheduled for each term or semester of your course.

You **must** have a satisfactory academic result for each term or semester.

Note: a registered course is one that is on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS).

Visa rule 8206

You **must** remain with the education provider with which you originally enrolled for the first 6 months of the course, or for the duration of the course, if the course is for less than 6 months.

If you want to change education provider before completing the first **six months** of your principal course of study you **must** contact your current education provider for permission and a letter of release.

You will require a letter of offer from the new provider in order to apply for a letter of release from your original education provider. In most circumstances the new education provider will be restricted from enrolling students who have not completed 6 months of the principal course of study, for which their visa was issued, unless they have a letter of release.

Note: If you have been granted a visa to undertake two or more registered courses, you **must** remain with the education provider of the principal course for the first 6 months of the principal course, or for the duration of the principal course if the principal course is for less than 6 months. The principal course is the course that may be taken only after the completion of another of the courses.

Visa rule 8501

You **must** maintain adequate arrangements for health insurance during your stay in Australia.

Note: under policy, this means that you must maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC).

Visa rule 8516

You **must** continue to satisfy the requirements for grant of your student visa.

This means, for example, that your main course of study must continue to be a course in the education sector that matches your student visa, and that you must continue to have sufficient financial capacity to support your study and stay in Australia.

Visa rule 8517

You **must** maintain adequate schooling arrangements for your school-age dependants who join you in Australia on a student dependant visa for more than 3 months.

Visa rule 8532

You **must** maintain support, accommodation, and general welfare arrangements that have been approved by your education provider if you have **not** turned 18, and are **not** staying in Australia with a parent, a custodian, or a relative who has been nominated by your parent or a custodian, is aged at least 21 and is of good character.

Note: you **must** not change those arrangements without the written approval of your education provider.

Visa rule 8533

You **must** notify your education provider of your residential address in Australia within 7 days of arriving in Australia.

You **must** notify your education provider of any change in your residential address within 7 days of the change.

You **must** notify your education provider of a change of education provider within 7 days of receiving the electronic Confirmation of Enrolment certificate or evidence of enrolment.

Visa rule 8535

You are **not entitled** to be granted a further substantive visa, other than a Student Visa with Permission to Work (made on form 157P or 157P Internet), while you remain in Australia.

Note: the effect of this visa condition is that, except in extremely limited circumstances, it **will not be possible for you to remain in Australia** beyond the authorised period of stay shown on your visa label.
